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EDITORIAL



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The Quais du Polar festival was born 19 years ago from a paradox: the desire to offer as many people as possible a true opening to the world and to make the city of Lyon the center of the world for a weekend. The event proudly displays the richness of this dual identity by being both resolutely international and deeply rooted in Lyon.

The international aspect will be developed this year with the presence of 125 authors from Spain, the United States, Japan, Poland, Croatia, Colombia, India, Mexico, Israel, and more. In total, 18 nationalities will be represented and will fuel discussions around a genre that deals with contemporary realities and seeks to offer readers manuals to understand and analyse our societies.

Through the voices of these guests from around the world, we will try to better decipher current events and their darkest aspects. Topics will include geopolitics and espionage, revenge and corruption, drug trafficking and the dark web, ecology and violence against women, death and youth delinquency, the weight of the past and resilience. We will continue our exploration of the world by rediscovering Spain, its authors, and their works through a rich focus that will mix literature, cinema, and gastronomy.

Lyon will become a vast playground thanks to the Great Investigation, which will offer an unprecedented and historical journey through the city's streets. Quais du Polar will also be present through different forms of cultural, educational, or recreational activities in libraries, museums, cinemas, and theatres in Lyon. The authors will be invited to participate in meetings that will mix literature, art, music, history, and cinema. And since the Metropolis offers us a rich breeding ground for the crime genre, Interpol, the Lyon Judicial Tribunal, the Scientific Police of Ecully, and the National Police School of Saint-Cyr-Au-Mont-d'Or will also be part of the festival.

As every year, the festival will also visit schools, prisons, and hospitals and strengthen its actions in favour of accessibility thanks to the support of the Hachette Foundation for Reading. And to ensure that this celebration benefits as many people as possible, Quais du Polar will radiate in 25 cities in the region and this year will offer a new national operation, the Month of Crime, which will extend throughout April with the support of the group of independent booksellers, Les Libraires Ensemble.

Often considered uncompromising a reflection of society, the crime genre allows us to dissect the world and denounce its injustices and abuses. Proof of the power of literature, it is generally absent from countries where censorship and the absence of democracy prevail. This new edition of the Quais du Polar festival will therefore be an opportunity to think of those who do not have the chance to express themselves and think freely, and to savor this freedom that is offered to us to learn, inform ourselves, exchange, travel, discover, cultivate ourselves, read, and sometimes even rebel.

FREE ACCESS

The access to all main venues, conferences, meetings, and youth events of the festival is free, subject to availability. Upon presentation of your Quais du Polar Association membership card, you will be allowed privileged access to conferences! (Except cinema screenings and some events from the "en echo au festival" programme).

ACCESSIBILITY

Quais du Polar is committed to strengthening the accessibility of the festival to people with disabilities (PRM, deaf and hard of hearing, visually impaired, mental and psychological disabilities, etc.). Various actions are proposed: presentation of books in large print and books adapted for DYS children, live translation in French Sign Language and subtitling of meetings, provision of audio headsets, adapted signage, training of teams, and integration of people with disabilities or in the process of reintegration into the team of volunteers.

For a citizen event committed to access to reading for everyone!

In 2023, thanks to the support of the **HACHETTE FOUNDATION FOR READING**, the association is consolidating the accessibility aspect of the festival so that people who are far from culture, especially those with disabilities, can fully enjoy their festival experience.

Specific actions will be implemented before and during the festival, including:

- Several meetings with live subtitling or translation in French Sign Language thanks to the intervention of specialized LSF interpreters.
- Certain rooms will also be equipped with magnetic loops for people with hearing aids.
- A coordinator and a team of trained volunteers will be assigned to inform and accompany people who wish it from their arrival by subway, bus or other means of transportation, and throughout their journey to the festival venues (conferences, Grande Librairie, etc.).

All our locations are accessible to people with reduced mobility and comply with PMR standards.

ENVIRONMENTAL FRIENDLINESS

The Quais du Polar team has been aware of environmental issues for several years and has been working, on its own scale, to limit its carbon footprint and waste production during the festival. All of our service providers and suppliers are local companies, we limit our paper printing, and we prioritize trains for our French and European guests. This year, we have decided to reduce our waste by minimizing the use of plastic water bottles for our teams, guests, and audience as much as possible.

THE BIGGEST NOIR EVENT IN FRANCE AND EUROPE

As the first crime fiction festival in France and Europe, Quais du Polar has become one of the most important events around books. It is THE unmissable meeting for crime fiction fans in Europe and owes its vitality to its original format in the world of literary events:

• A festival that showcases the latest editorial news of the genre with an openness to crime fiction in the broadest sense, from noir novels to thrillers, and which allows for multiple incursions into "white" literature, comics, or even children's literature.

• Aware that the crime fiction genre is also an asset for renewing the usual audience of literary and cultural events, Quais du Polar seeks to open up its programming as much as possible with varied proposals: literature, cinema, music, exhibitions, series, theater, games...

• A festival open to the city and the Lyon metropolis and the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region.

• An event that offers new and unprecedented fun experiences for festival-goers: city investigation, museum treasure hunt, escape game...

• A literary event where each year, in a friendly atmosphere, the greatest authors of the genre from all over the world come together.

Beyond this public image, Quais du Polar is also and above all a citizen festival that advocates for access to culture for all by offering free access to the event and activities aimed at audiences who are the furthest from culture and literature. Education is also an important aspect of the event, through the fight against illiteracy (Dictées Noires in partnership with the National Agency for the Fight Against Illiteracy) and numerous pedagogical activities specifically adapted to different age groups.

Finally, Quais du Polar has also become a reference in the professional field, offering every year a training program for teachers and librarians in partnership with the ENSSIB, and a program of professional meetings, Polar Connection, where professionals from the book, audiovisual, and more broadly from the cultural sector meet. The festival has also set itself the mission of promoting international professional exchanges and showcasing French-language crime fiction abroad. For several years now, it has been working with the Institut français, thus joining literary events in different countries (Italy, Germany, Romania, China, India, South Korea...) to highlight French-speaking authors.

True to its commitments and convictions, the Quais du Polar team is therefore pursuing its development on these various axes, looking back with pleasure on the path traveled and concerned about a future that is always as rich in exchanges, meetings and openness to the world.

A MONTH OF NOIR

QUAIS DU POLAR LAUNCHES ITS "MONTH OF NOIR" OPERATION

Over the years, Quais du Polar has had a growing impact on promoting crime fiction, by creating a "**NOIR SEASON**" during which publishers release new titles, foreign authors go on tour, bookstores organize events around the genre, and major French media outlets publish special crime fiction features. This season has helped to highlight the literary genre, which is now a favourite French readers', with nearly 22 million books sold each year in France.

To extend the "**NOIR SPIRIT**" beyond the festival and promote the genre throughout April at national level, Quais du Polar is launching a new initiative called "The Month of Noir". This will involve specific communication and a comprehensive programme dedicated to the "Month of Noir", which will include recent crime fiction selections, book signings and events in bookstores throughout the month, publisher promotions, and some key activities related to the genre.

Quais du Polar's partner for this initiative will be the group of independent bookstores "Libraires Ensemble", who will welcome festival guests, especially foreign authors, for book signings and other events in their stores across France.

Quais du Polar plans to repeat this initiative every year.

INTERNATIONALLY

Every year, with the arrival of authors and professionals from around the world, Lyon becomes an international hub for books and culture. This openness to the contemporary world and its realities helps to create connections and inspire projects.

Quais du Polar promotes French-language crime fiction and its authors worldwide by developing international exchanges that today enable the event and the genre to shine beyond our borders. Supported by the French Institute, the City and Metropolis of Lyon as part of their Convention, Quais du Polar explores the Cities of the Book/Cities of Crime Fiction and builds exchange and collaboration projects around them.

IN SPAIN

Polar Connection, always open to the international scene, will explore Spain and meet with Spanish book professionals (publishers, agents, and booksellers) during Polar Connection and through an invitation to the BC Negra festival. This spring, *La desconocida/L'inconnue du port*, a crime novel written collaboratively by Olivier Truc for France and Rosa Montero for Spain, will be published by Alfaguara in Spain and by Points in France.

LOOKING AHEAD

Several initiatives are underway to continue these collaborations around the Cities of the Book/Cities of Crime Fiction, including the upcoming collaborative crime novel that will feature a new author duo to continue the series. Thanks to the support of the French Institute in inviting international professionals for Polar Connection, collaborations are being prepared in Lyon starting this spring. As a trailblazer, a booklet titled "French-language Crime Fiction and Authors to Discover" is being distributed in the French international cultural network and with the support of Bief, to international publishers in order to contribute to the dissemination and promotion of French-language crime fiction worldwide.

NOIR IN MUMBAI, INDIA

After a setback due to health conditions, the Noir in Mumbai project culminated in a successful event in November 2022 in collaboration with the French Institute of India and the Alliance française of Bombay. A trio of French authors, Johana Gustawsson, Sophie Hénaff, and Jérôme Loubry, participated in the crime fiction focus integrated into the Tata Lit Live! literary festival to present their works to the Indian public. And an urban investigation, inspired by the Lyon experience and written by author Kalpana Swaminathan, gathered a large and enthusiastic audience in the heart of the historic Kala Ghoda district.

POLAR CONNECTION

10th ÉDITION !

Polar Connection is the professional program of Quais du Polar. Built around highlights featuring experts in the genre, as well as meeting spaces between accredited professionals and identification of relevant elements in the festival's program, this program brings together French and international professionals whose activity is related to the crime fiction genre. Polar Connection is designed as a toolbox for professionals in the book, audiovisual, digital, and cultural sectors.

For 3 days, from March 31 to April 2, Polar Connection offers professionals with accreditation:

- A meeting point reserved for accredited professionals: conference rooms and spaces for individual meetings or friendly cocktail times at the heart of the festival, at the *Palais de la Bourse*;
- A program of round tables, workshops, and presentations on professional subjects and customized "Extras" events for participants, with involved partners (Interpol, Musée de l'Imprimerie, Police Scientifique...);
- Privileged access to festival events, a source of identification and inspiration.

PROGRAM FOR PROFESSIONALS IN THE CRIME FICTION INDUSTRY

There will be meetings with publishers and book industry professionals from Spain, the country setting the pace for this year's festival, as well as from Bulgaria, Egypt, Estonia, England, and Hungary. There will be opportunities to discuss the latest developments in the genre and the book industry. Connections will be made with film and audio-visual media through the presentation of the Polar en Séries award and discussions on audio-visual adaptation and storytelling for video games.

The professional programme will take place in multiple formats, such as workshops, pitch sessions, catalogue or project presentations, and informal gatherings for the sharing of ideas and experiences.

Polar Connection will feature a focus on the Franco-Spanish collaborative writing experience that resulted in the crime novel L'inconnue du port, written by Olivier Truc and Rosa Montero. Other workshops will focus on inclusion, translation, and mediation.

POLAR IN SERIES AWARD

The Polar in Series award was created, with the support of the Civil Society of French-Language Publishers (SCELF), to be part of the Polar Connection programme. It identifies and rewards a French-language noir novel, thriller, or polar for its qualities and potential for adaptation into a TV series.

The award is based on a call for submissions sent to publishing houses. You can find the titles in the running on page 20.

Among the six finalists, our jury made up of film and audio-visual professionals is responsible for selecting and designating the 2023 winner.

THE QDP TALENT POOL

Many young or future professionals in the book and audio-visual industries, passionate about crime fiction, gravitate around the festival, particularly among the volunteers or partner training organizations. Some professionals presented at Polar Connection will be called upon to meet them and talk about their job, practices, and motivations. This tailor-made program aims to share experiences and enthusiasm for crime fiction, to discover the professions in these industries, and to create links between young people in training and professionals.

THE MAIN THEMES

For the next edition, Quais du Polar will explore **SPANISH CRIME FICTION**, which like French crime fiction, has experienced a new resurgence since the mid-2000s, becoming a true editorial and cultural phenomenon. With a significant presence of authors representing the variety and richness of the genre, we will explore the sometimes dark and tortuous history of this country. We will wander with them through the streets of Barcelona or Madrid and invoke the tutelary figure of Manuel Vázquez Montalbán, who passed away 20 years ago. A dive into the soul of a modern monarchy where books and culture occupy a major place, through literature, cinema, and gastronomy.

Various formats

Quais du Polar is a festival that brings together authors from around the world to exchange ideas on noir literature and the state of the world. The festival offers a diverse and demanding program of over 80 meetings and conferences to encourage interaction and discussion with the public. The events take place in prestigious and historic locations, as well as unexpected and unusual places, on water and through the streets of the city.

>> The Palais de la Bourse, Hôtel de Ville and Chapelle de la Trinité will host meetings and conferences with invited authors throughout the weekend.

>> **The Opéra Amphitheater** will vibrate to the rhythm of musical encounters with William Boyle and Peter Farris, and will also host a screening of the Tokyo Vice series followed by a discussion with Jake Adelstein.

>> Literary cruises on the Bateaux Lyonnais offer readers the chance to spend an hour with an author on the Saône River. With: Jake Adelstein, Michel Bussi, Javier Cercas, R. J. Ellory, Elisabeth George, and more.

>> **Literary bus tours** in the streets of the city will introduce readers to those who live what makes us shiver in crime novels: experts in the courts, police, Interpol, and forensics with Lyon City Tour and ALIBI.

>> **The Lyon Court of Justice** will host two discussions that mix the views of authors and experts in justice on the themes of the voice of women (with Pauline Guéna, Dominik Moll, Alice Géraud, and Anaïs Renevier) and on the fascination for serial killers (with Céline Denjean, Danya Kukafka, Franck Ollivier, and Ivy Pochoda).

>> **The Cité de la Gastronomie** will be the setting for a brunch and an original exchange between Lyon and Barcelona, between gastronomy and literature. >> **Translation battle:** two translators from the Association of Literary Translators of France (ATLF) will delve into the unpublished translation of a text by Spanish author Jordi Ledesma. In a true battle, they defend their translation choices and answer questions from the audience.

>> "Meurtres zen" (Zen Murders) Yoga Session in partnership with Lizzie editions: festival-goers will be invited to relax with an original yoga session that combines crime and well-being. Actor Guillaume Orsat will read excerpts from Karsten Dusse's novel, "Les Meurtres zen, Des meurtres qui font du bien" (Zen Murders, Murders That Feel Good), a text that proposes a truly radical solution... to eliminate everything that harms us.

THE COLLABORATIVE CRIME NOVEL

Following a first project led by Romanian author Lucian–Dragos Bogdan and French author Jacky Schwartzmann in 2019, and a second project between German author Max Annas and French author Jérôme Leroy in 2022, Quais du Polar and Points editions are now proposing a novel written by two authors from two different countries. "L'Inconnue du port" (La desconocida, in the Spanish version) is the result of a collaborative writing project between Spanish author Rosa Montero (published by Alfaguara and Seix Barral, and in French by Métailié) and French author Olivier Truc (published by Métailié and in Spanish by Destino).

This crime novel, which will be published simultaneously in Spain by Alfaguara in March 2023, brings together two masters of the genre in a joint project, where each author wrote alternating chapters. The two main characters, one French and the other Spanish, subtly touch on the cultural differences between their countries, with the aim of contributing to a better mutual understanding.

This writing project was initiated by the international Quais du Polar festival, in collaboration with Points and Alfaguara editions, and is supported by the Institut français/Ville et Métropole de Lyon Convention.

MUSICAL Programming

Initiated in 2017 with the Regional Conservatory of Lyon, the musical meetings combine literature and music. This year, two highlights around rock and metal are planned with musicians from the Conservatory and the Lyon school Skull of Rock:

ROCK

William Boyle, a former record store owner whose works are dotted with musical references, will talk about his passion for rock and the place music holds in his life and work, before giving way to the Darwells band to shake up the afternoon of festival-goers.

METAL

Former singer in the band CABLE (Connecticut), **Peter Farris** recorded three albums before devoting himself fully to his life as a writer. A music enthusiast, he should not remain indifferent to the dark universe of Mind Imperium.

Moreover, Cati Baur will lead a young public illustration workshop at the bookstore stand on Sunday morning.

Since its inception, Quais du Polar has partnered with many cultural organizations in Lyon and the region on various projects related to noir and detective literature. Lyon City Tour and ALIBI magazine will also renew their bus tours through the city streets to meet justice experts.

A beautiful culinary experience will take place: festival-goers will be able to discover Barcelona's cuisine in the company of authors Rosa Montero, Olivier Truc, and Carlos Zanón, who will all talk about the place that Barcelona holds in their work and their lives.

On March 30th and 31st, students from third grade to high school will be able to participate in the Great Investigation and meet with the invited authors. This year, Chrysostome Gourio, Malika Ferdjoukh, Thierry Colombié, Víctor del Árbol and Jean-Christophe Tixier will come to exchange with students about their career paths and works. With the support of the City of Lyon, Quais du Polar is renewing the Youth Prize Quais du Polar/ Ville de Lyon. For this project, implemented by the Ambassadors of the Book of the Afev in the classrooms, more than 200 primary school students will vote for their favourite book from a selection of 5 before presenting the prize to the winner.

Secondary school students can participate in the festival's Short Story Contest, organized this year in partnership with the Maison de l'Environnement, argue in favour of their favourite crime novel during the Battle Polar, and produce podcasts and articles on the festival by interviewing authors, booksellers, members of the festival's organizing team, and members of the public. Finally, for some high school classes, school meetings will be the culmination of projects implemented throughout the year. Students will meet, among others, the author Pauline Guéna and the director Dominik Moll as part of the project One Book, One Film on audio-visual adaptation, and others will conclude their translation workshops by meeting the writer William Boyle.

Quais du Polar is also relaunching its "**Dictées Noires**" (Dark Dictation), in partnership with the National Agency for the Fight against Illiteracy. Malika Ferdjoukh will be invited to read and dictate an excerpt from one of her books to the participating classes. Fabrice Drouelle, on the other hand, will provide the Dictation for the general public.

QUAIS DU POLAR IN PRISON

For several years, with the support of the DRAC Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes and the interregional penitentiary services direction (DISP) of Lyon, the association has been implementing the action "Polar behind the walls" with the aim of promoting reading and the crime fiction genre in the prison environment. Authors will visit penitentiary institutions in the Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes region to (re)introduce incarcerated individuals to crime and noir literature. Meetings with detainees will be prepared in advance by teams from municipal and departmental libraries and the educational service of the institutions.

For the 2023 edition, voluntary detainees will participate in the Quais du Polar short story competition. Some have even benefited from writing workshops with author Marc Fernandez to prepare them. Five penitentiary institutions will also be part of the jury for the Quais du Polar Readers' Prize. A special mention will reward the novel from the selection that obtains the most votes from them.

Quais du Polar is renewing its actions in hospital settings. Sophie Hénaff will meet with patients at the Henry Gabrielle Hospital in Saint-Genis-Laval, and a children's book illustrator will visit the Woman Mother Child Hospital in Bron for a children's workshop. La Ferme du Vinatier will also offer a mystery walk entitled "Mystère au Vinatier" to introduce the public to the park of the Le Vinatier Hospital Center.

TRAINING DAY

Quais du Polar is organizing a training day for teachers, librarians, and documentalists in collaboration with the Lyon Municipal Libraries Network, the DRAC Auvergne-Rhône-Alpes, and the Lyon Rectorate. The objective of the training is to sensitize these professionals to the crime fiction genre and provide them with ideas for working on the genre with both adults and children. The training day will take place on March 30th at the ENSSIB in Villeurbanne. The event will include a presentation of the latest adult crime fiction releases by PAGE des libraires, a masterclass on crime fiction and non-fiction by 10/18 publishing house, and presentations by Voir de près and Rageot on their approach to supporting people with DYS disorders.

Mesplède was an editor, critic, historian, and an enlightened and passionate lover of crime fiction. He was also a friend and companion of Quais du Polar, having been involved in its inception and all its developments. He did invaluable work to disseminate and transmit a culture of crime fiction. In 2022, to pay tribute to him and extend his work, we created the **Claude Mesplède / Quais du Polar Prize** for non-fiction books on crime fiction. This prize rewards a work that contributes to a better understanding of the genre, in the form of an essay, a historical work, correspondence, documents, an investigation, a translation, original editions of complete or unpublished works, new translations, or academic and university works. Audiovisual works are also eligible.

The awards for the **Youth Short Story Contest** and **the Quais du Polar / ALIBI Short Story Contest** will be presented with all the other prizes.

The European Crime Fiction Prize awarded by Le Point magazine will also be presented on this occasion.
